Life at Fowler has changed dramatically for the 360 youth and elders that call Fowler "home." The term "Fowler Family" has taken on a new meaning as our residents have not seen their own families since March 12, except through technology. Our staff has sacrificed their family needs to be here. The entire Fowler team is on-site trying to fill the space of family members, friends and volunteers who previously provided socialization and emotional support, shopped for groceries, and performed many other supportive functions. Our residents who have weathered other catastrophic experiences in their lives, have provided hope and encouragement. My heart is full as we have loved and supported each other through this anxious, tiring time. While others may be preparing for a return to normalcy, "Fort Fowler" remains closed and our residents remain isolated from the outside world. We feel at some level, this will continue for months.

One advantage to the pandemic is that it has created clarity in many aspects of our lives. The need for community and connection has been intensified yet simplified. Through the lenses of hope, we find God ever present in our midst. Efforts to love and care for those who need it the most, our youth and elders, are as timely today as they were when our namesake Juliette first dreamed of "the home."
