that not one of the 16,000 nursing homes in the United States used iPods, Cohen made it his mission to bring the power of music to others.

Fowler Administrator Diana Patten learned of the program and through donor support, she secured an initial twenty iPods and sought the help of Tri-M members at Ursuline Academy to implement Music & Memories at Fowler. The music honor society group interviewed residents, and in some instances, family members, to learn what types of music the resident preferred. They downloaded favorite songs and hymns, creating individualized playlists for each participant.


