COVID UPDATE:

- Yesterday, Dallas County announced 455 new cases and 3 deaths
 - They also reported that 4 fully vaccinated people died from COVID in Dallas County
 - These individuals were immune compromised and were taking a medication that was known to reduce the affects from the vaccine
 - There are numbers all over the country that mirror the similar low percentage of those vaccinated dying from COVID
 - The positivity rate for Dallas County is at 4.4% which eliminates our routine testing of vaccinated staff
 - Those not vaccinated will continued to have monthly routine testing
- At Fowler, we need to report that we have two independent residents at FCA who were fully vaccinated that have confirmed cases of COVID – one is in the ICU
 - The vaccine is not a get out of jail free card it is an added protection from serious illness and has proven to reduce death from COVID
 - We should remain diligent with our Love Your Neighbor Basics which has served us well over the past year
 - Wear your mask especially in public with others not in your household
 - Maintain your distance from others refrain from large crowds
 - Wash your hands frequently
 - Sanitize surface

• FOWLER UPDATES:

- Spring maintenance work:
 - We have hired an arborist who is overseeing the removal of our dead plants from the winter storm – they started today
 - The brush will be collected and once we have it all, they will bring in a woodchipper and we will have our own mulch
 - We have also expanded our pest control contracts
 - It's not only the time of year, but the road construction in surrounding areas are disrupting the natural habitats of pests and they are looking for a new home - we are fortifying Fort Fowler

- We are also implementing routine inspections in residences as a proactive step to quickly identify indications of pests
- This week is National Skilled Nursing Care Week
 - We honor the collaborative commitment of skilled nursing care facilities and their staff in providing compassionate care to their residents
 - Skilled Nursing Appreciation week was established by the American Health Care Association (AHCA) in 1967, National Skilled Nursing Care Week® (NSNCW) recognizes the essential role of skilled nursing care centers in caring for America's frail, elderly, and disabled. The week starts each year on Mother's Day and is celebrated through the following Saturday.
- This Friday, we will host the Juliette Fowler Communities Board for our quarterly board meeting – this meeting will be held via Zoom
- This Saturday, the One Heart Society, Fowler's volunteer auxiliary, is hosting Tacos and Tunes
 - Mi Cocina is catering tacos for \$20 per person which includes beverages
 - If you prefer not to have tacos and just join us for the tunes, there is no charge
 - The event will take place in front of the Administration Center and spill into the parking lot.
 - We will be setting up chairs for residents
 - We ask families to bring chairs or blankets
- On May 13, at 2pm we will host a butterfly release
 - Chaplain Venessa will lead us through a short service and has invited ministers from surrounding churches to join us
 - Together we will acknowledge and honor what we have experienced this past year, as we emerge from our apartments and offices to celebrate the newness of this season
 - We are excited to give thanks for God's faithfulness and ever guiding presence, remembering that God's love endures forever
 - Going forward our daily activities may look different than they have in the past year and we are taking small steps in the "opening of our campus; this will be a moment to express gratitude and officially begin anew
 - We will continue to follow our Love Your Neighbor Basics
 - We will gather in the Harwood garden and on all paths leading to it
