- COVID UPDATE:
 - Yesterday Dallas County reported 444 new cases
 - Our COVID positivity rate continues to go down this week it is at 4.45%
- FOWLER UPDATES:
 - Because of the lower positivity rate, we will be reopening the chapel on 11/28 for inperson worship!
 - This will be the first Sunday of Advent and our service will include the hanging of the greens
 - We will also have special music

- Today is Dutch-American Heritage day. This day marks the longstanding history and shared bonds between the Netherlands and the United States. On November 16, 1776, the Netherlands became the first country to formally recognize the United States of America. On that day, the governor of Sin Estasius ordered the island's cannons fired in response to the 13-gun salute from Andrew Doria as it sailed into the harbor of the Dutch island. Only four months before, the United States declared its independence from Great Britain. This simple act is recorded as the first salute to the American flag by a foreign nation. Congress officially designated November 16 as Dutch-American Heritage day in 1991.
- Today is also the U.N. recognized International Day for Tolerance. The International Day of Tolerance is a time for people to learn about respecting and recognizing the rights and beliefs of others. It is also a time of reflection and debate on the negative

effects of intolerance. Human rights activists use this day as an opportunity to speak out on human rights laws, especially with regard to banning and punishing hate crimes and discrimination against minorities. Many educators use the theme of this day to help students in classrooms or in lecture halls understand the issues centered on tolerance, human rights and nonviolence. May we all seek to educate ourselves on others cultures and perspectives in an attempt to eradicate intolerance around the world.
