COVID UPDATES:

- On Friday, the CDC updated its guidelines on wearing masks.
- Here are a few things for you to consider as you make your decisions
 - New variants of the virus are still expected to occur
 - Continue to use your best judgement about masking in public spaces the CDC suggests that people in areas with high community spread should still wear a mask indoors
 - If you are sick and need to be around others, wear a mask
 - If you are around someone known to have COVID, wear a mask
 - If you are at increased risk for severe illness, a mask would be beneficial
 - Masks are still recommended for at risk populations which includes older adults
 - Last Tuesday, we announced our updates which are in line with the CDC guidelines – no additional changes will occur at Fowler at this time
 - Masks are not required in our unlicensed areas
 - They are still required in our licensed areas
 - The vaccine remains the best protection against severe illness and death

- This year Mardi Gras festivities are set to take place on March 1st around the world a time filled with celebrations, parades, balls, and parties! - Did you know that each of the official colors of Mardi Gras has a secret meaning?
 Purple represents justice, gold symbolizes power, and green represents faith.
- And interestingly, the King Cake, a traditional dessert, has biblical roots dating back to Medieval Times, when French, Belgian, and Spanish cultures commemorated the 12th

day of Christmas with gifts and sweets. Biblically, the kings during this time would have been visiting the newborn baby Jesus, bringing gifts and sweets of their own. That's where the "king" in king cake comes from.
