• FOWLER UPDATES:

- Update on flood issues at Fowler Christian Apartments:
 - For the 3rd time in recent months, FCA residents on the first floor of C Building in our FCA Assisted Living have experienced flooding.
 - The plumbers continue to pull Personal Wipes and paper towels out of the pipes.
 - Outside plumbing professionals ran diagnostics on our all our drains and their findings are pending. Based on these reports, action will be taken.
 - IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT NO ONE FLUSHES PERSONAL WIPES OR PAPER TOWELS DOWN THE TOILETS in any building.
 - Despite the "flushable" labels, these products should never be flushed because they will clog your toilet and the sewer system. The products do not breakdown and disperse in the sewer system which causes a risk of clogging the plumbing or causing damage to sewer infrastructure.
 - These actions are creating serious inconvenience and potential safety hazards for residents, as well as unnecessary expense for our organization.
 - When we live in community, we need to be mindful of how our actions impact others. As part of your lease obligations, you must be considerate of your neighbors.
- This week, the maintenance team will begin routine maintenance checks in Jackson Living Center to confirm everything in your apartment is working and safe

- The International Day of Peace ("Peace Day") is observed around the world each year on 21 September.
- Established in 1981 by unanimous United Nations resolution 36/37, the General
 Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to "commemorating and strengthening the ideals of peace both within and among all nations and peoples."
- But achieving true peace entails much more than laying down arms. It requires building societies where all members feel they can flourish. It involves creating a world in which people where people are treated equally, regardless of Day provides a globally shared date for all humanity to commit to Peace above all differences and to contribute to building a Culture of Peace.
