- Good afternoon, Fowler Family!
- FOWLER UPDATES:
 - We have had an uptick of COVID in Pearl Nordan Care Center.
 - All those impacted are showing minimal symptoms, all are doing well and are isolating in their homes at Fowler
 - This is not the COVID we were dealing with in 2020. We have medications, testing and vaccines which have impacted the severity.
 - The guidance from Health and Human Services has reduced the bureaucracy for assisted living. We no longer must shut the entire building down for a single positive case. We are now treating COVID like any other transmissible infectious illness like the flu.
 - Those who are ill, isolate. We are able to keep our residents here in their homes among familiar environments and staff. Those who are caregivers, wear proper PPE, wash their hands and sanitize.
 - Visitation continues with appropriate notification and masking.
 - For the rest of us, we need to be mindful of our Love our Neighbor Basics especially during the flu and cold season mask, sanitize, wash your hands and stay home if ill.
 - At the request of many of our residents, we are in conversations with a licensed massage therapist to come to Fowler.
 - We will start with chair massages and eventually offer the opportunity for full body massage in the massage room at Jackson Living Center.
 - A chair massage will be \$1.50 a minute which is the going rate. A 15-minute chair massage would cost \$22.50. When we initiate full body massages, another rate will be applied.
 - We are looking to start chair massage services in February

- We celebrate Lunar New Year from Jan 22 through Feb 9
- This observance is celebrated by some 1.5 billion people. It marks the first new moon of the lunisolar calendar, which is used in Asian countries, including China, Vietnam, Singapore, and South Korea.
- This Lunar New Year is predicted to be of peace and optimism
- Lunar New Year is a celebration of the arrival of spring and the beginning of a new year on the lunisolar calendar. It is the most important holiday in China and is also widely celebrated in South Korea, Vietnam, and countries with a significant overseas Asian population.
- It begins with the first new moon of the <u>lunar calendar</u> and ends on the first <u>full</u> moon of the lunar calendar 15 days later. The lunar calendar is based on the cycles of the moon, so the dates of the <u>holiday</u> vary slightly from year to year, beginning sometime between January 21 and February 20 according to Western calendars.
- Approximately 10 days before the beginning of the new lunar year, houses are thoroughly cleaned to remove any bad luck that might be <u>lingering</u> inside, a custom called "sweeping of the grounds.

- Did you know our Gregorian calendar, introduced in 1582, is based on the solar year (the time it takes the Earth to orbit the sun). The lunisolar calendar is based on phases of the moon.
