COVID UPDATES:

- After nearly 3 years, we believe the COVID pandemic will soon transition to an endemic.
 - What's the difference?
 - Pandemics are known to cause widespread illness, death, and hardship. An endemic means a disease is spreading in a community at the normal or expected level. A pandemic shifts to an endemic once the disease becomes more stable and manageable.
 - As a result, CMS has modified our response to a COVID instance and has reduced the reporting processes.
 - We will now respond in the same manner as we do with any other communicable disease.
 - We will see COVID vaccines move to a routine annual shot with the intent to minimize illness and death
 - COVID is still threatening to those with compromised immune systems and older adults who are not vaccinated we strongly encourage that you get vaccinated and maintain your vaccination status.
 - We will continue our screening at all entrances through our visitor management system.
 - The visitor management system was developed to track all visitors, volunteers, and vendors.
 - Please continue to monitor all visitors and encourage them to check in and secure a name badge.
- With that, today is our last Briefing!
 - We started the Briefing on March 11, 2020 at the outbreak of the pandemic and after 3 years, it is time to sunset this form of communication
 - We are developing a new communication piece that will launch in April to provide community-wide news. This Briefing format will no longer exist.
 - The communication will be available to residents, families and team members.
 - Thank you to those who have been faithful in watching, listening, and reading the Briefing.

• FOWLER UPDATES:

- An update on The Peak:
 - We currently have 26 residents; 10 more move-ins are scheduled; 10 more are in the process of being scheduled and 18 applications are being processed.
 - This means that we will soon have 60+ residents at The Peak with a goal of 144.

A Letter from Rev. Venessa Harmel:

Hello Fowler Family!

As I am sure you know, I am up here in the mid-west town of Danville Indiana. I began a Pastoral Call with Danville Christian Church, DOC on Jan. 1st. Never think you know what God will work out for your life. But, do know it will be a wonderful surprise!

I have been busy getting to know people and places. Adjusting to the colder weather, the 8am sunrises (late for me) and the 11pm local news. Not to mention the looonnng distance from Texas.

The Town of Danville reminds me of Georgetown Texas back in the 1990's. It is the county seat of Hendricks County, just about 12 miles outside of Indianapolis. The population is around eleven thousand. They are planning for lots of growth, which proves to be headed towards Danville, but at the same time they are selective with the zoning laws. – just like GT back in the day.

DCC has 60-70 folks in Worship each week, and the church building is located on the square, so it is an historical building in Danville and very well known in the center of town.

I have only lived in Texas or New Mexico, so this is a very different experience for me, mostly all good, thankfully, I learned a long time ago to simply embrace change and look forward to experiencing God in new and different ways – but always with the faithfulness of God, which never changes.

The food is different, they are not sure what tex-mex means...but I did find a "Chuy's" about 20 miles from my house – that made me very happy! And yes, it has been cold, even snowed a couple of times, but they know how to treat the roads and it does not do the ice thing that happens in Texas.

Zeena (my dog) and I are doing well, she loves the cooler weather and wants to walk often. We have a three-bedroom condominium in a quiet neighborhood. The property management company does the lawn maintenance and that includes shoveling snow!

The members of DCC are extremely hospitable –and willing to help each other in any way they can. I am excited about the opportunities for both physical and spiritual growth and to partner with the congregation to move us forward.
